Nomination of Graham Goulding for an RHSV Award of Merit

Graham Goulding, OAM, of Moe & District Historical Society has made outstanding and enduring contributions to the preservation of Gippsland's history and heritage.

Through M&DHS, he has performed many duties as Vice President 2002-, and *Coach News* journal co-editor. But his work has benefitted societies well beyond.

In 2006, Graham became Secretary/Treasurer of the Gippsland Association of Affiliated Historical Societies (resigning in 2023 after 17 years), organising the day-long AGMs for regional representatives, as well as instigating then improving digital communications between all, including group newsletters, and efficiently and expertly managing individual requests.

Graham was instrumental in establishing the Gippsland History Awards. Presented annually at GAAHS, these acknowledge members' contributions to their own societies and the region as a whole.

'As a Centre for Gippsland Studies Advisory Committee member to Federation University (Churchill) Graham played a leading role in advocating for an archive to be kept at the Churchill campus. Graham travelled to the Public Records Office in Melbourne, the Bendigo Regional Archive and to Federation University Ballarat as part of the advocacy. Ultimately the University decided on creating the Centre for Gippsland and Regional Studies Collection.'
